6th Grade Summer Tissue Box Book Report

Step One – You should have selected and read your ~100+-page fiction novel which is grade level appropriate for you. Return this form with your finished project.

Step Two– Once you have finished your book, create your tissue box project. You will need to have a tissue box (not used – it should have tissues still in it!). Wrap the tissue box with construction paper or the white side of wrapping paper, but still leave a slit in the top for the tissue so that we can actually use it in our classroom.

Here is what should be on each side of the tissue box:

- **Top:** The side that is on top with the slit should have the title of your book (underlined!), the author’s full name, and the year the book was written or published.
- **Bottom:** Your full name and the date due
- **Side 1: (long side)** Explain the exposition (basic situation), rising action, climax, and resolution of your book, as well as any internal or external conflicts. You must describe each of these elements of the book in complete sentences.
- **Side 2:(short side)** Illustrate a neat, colored picture of the main character/protagonist of your novel. Write a five-sentence description about the character. Or use the main character's name and create an Acronym poem that describes them.
- **Side 3 (long side)** Illustrate your favorite scene in the story. Include a passage from the scene (with quotations, since you are taking it directly from the text) and make sure to include the page number where you found it.
- **Side 4: (short Side)** Based on a scale of 1-10 rate the book and give reasons for your rating. Should be about 5 sentences

Grading: I will be using this scoring guide to determine your grade (worth 40 points). Make sure not to lose this sheet - you must turn it in with your tissue box!!!
